

The 15th EWDA Scientific Conference's Code of Conduct



1. Purpose

The EWDA 2024 Conference is committed to providing a safe and inclusive environment for all participants, regardless of gender, sexual orientation, disability, physical appearance, race, ethnicity, religion, or any other personal characteristic. This Code of Conduct outlines our expectations for all attendees, speakers, sponsors, organisers, and volunteers.

2. Expected Behaviour

All participants are expected to:

- Treat each other with respect and consideration.
- Be mindful of your words and actions, avoiding offensive or discriminatory language and behaviour.
- Engage in open and constructive communication, valuing diverse opinions and experiences.
- Be aware of and respectful towards cultural differences.
- Report any incidents of inappropriate behaviour to conference organisers.

3. Unacceptable Behaviour

Unacceptable behaviour includes, but is not limited to:

- Harassment, sexism, intimidation, or discrimination in any form.
- Offensive or inappropriate verbal or written comments, including slurs and jokes.
- Disruption of talks, sessions, or other conference events.
- Invasion of personal space or any form of unwelcome physical contact.
- Unauthorised recording or photography without consent.

4. Reporting Procedures

If you experience or witness any violation of this Code of Conduct, please report the incident immediately to a conference organiser, volunteer, or staff member.

5. Consequences of Unacceptable Behaviour

Conference organisers reserve the right to take appropriate actions in response to violations of this Code of Conduct, including but not limited to:

- Verbal or written warnings.
- Removal from the conference premises without a refund.
- Reporting the incident to appropriate authorities if necessary.
